## **Accreditation Process**

The Center for Montessori Education at Trine University (CMETU) is in its initial year and is dedicated to Montessori authenticity and best practices, as well as all of the high standards upheld in the Franks School of Education and Trine University.

The Center for Montessori Education is in the Self-Study portion of seeking accreditation with a nationally recognized organization and has highly qualified faculty of experienced professionals from within the region, representing both public and private Montessori schools.

The affiliation and accreditation process requires a lengthy self-study, takes up to two years from inception, and includes the involvement of the founding cohort of students. The timeline established involves completion of the self-study and on-site accreditation visit prior to the completion and graduation of the first cohort of the program. CMETU adheres to the highest of standards and requirements, although that in no way suggests affiliation or accreditation at this time.
